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Statutory Role of RSLs -Origins

- 1999 – Homelessness Task Force set up
- 2000 – Interim Report
- 2001 – Housing (Scotland) Act
- 2002 – Final Report
- 2003 – Homelessness (Scotland) Act

Housing (Scotland) Act 2001

- Section 5 gave LAs powers to refer homeless cases to RSLs
- RSL must comply with LA request within a reasonable period of time
- Very limited reasons for refusal

Some Section 5 Statistics (2005/6)

- Almost 4000 homeless people housed
- This is 14% of all RSL allocations
- Around 7000 referrals
- Success rate of referrals around 56%
- 98% given permanent tenancies....

....however, this is only part of the picture....

Non-Statutory Contribution by RSLs

.....there are other routes into RSL stock for homeless people.

- All RSL allocations policies must give reasonable preference to homeless (1987 Act)
- CHR commonalities exercise – homelessness given highest priority in almost every RSL policy
- SCORE – 42% of ALL allocations by RSLs going to homeless
- RSLs not always good at measuring/publishing allocations outcomes

Section 5 Operational Difficulties

- Inconsistencies in interpreting protocols
- Multiple referral=high failure rate
- Section 5 vs Nominations Agreements
- CHR further complicates
- SG recognises that work needs to be done
 - commissioned review of Section 5

Wider Challenges Facing RSLs

- RTB restrictions end in 2012!!

- Solutions need to be more than just a numbers game
- Avoid sectoral defensiveness
- Expand the role of RSLs
